

Rapid7 Data Privacy Framework

Self-Certification Notice

Introduction

This Rapid7 Data Privacy Framework Self-Certification Notice (“**DPF Notice**”) applies in combination with any Rapid7 privacy notice (“**Privacy Notice**”) that expressly links to it or that otherwise expressly incorporates it by reference.

Compliance with the Data Privacy Framework

Rapid7, Inc., and Rapid7 LLC (collectively, “**Rapid7**”) comply with the EU-U.S. Data Privacy Framework (“**EU-U.S. DPF**”), the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF, and the Swiss-U.S. Data Privacy Framework (“**Swiss-U.S. DPF**”) as set forth by the U.S. Department of Commerce.

Rapid7 has certified to the U.S. Department of Commerce that it adheres to the EU-U.S. Data Privacy Framework Principles (“**EU-U.S. DPF Principles**”) with regard to the processing of personal information received from the European Union in reliance on the EU-U.S. DPF and from the United Kingdom (and Gibraltar) in reliance on the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF. Rapid7 has also certified to the U.S. Department of Commerce that it adheres to the Swiss-U.S. Data Privacy Framework Principles (“**Swiss-U.S. DPF Principles**”) with regard to the processing of personal information received from Switzerland in reliance on the Swiss-U.S. DPF.

If there is any conflict between the terms in this DPF Notice or the Privacy Notice and the EU-U.S. DPF Principles and/or the Swiss-U.S. DPF Principles, the Principles shall govern. Complaints

Dispute resolution

In compliance with the EU-U.S. DPF and the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF and the Swiss-U.S. DPF, Rapid7 commits to cooperate and comply respectively with the advice of the panel established by the EU data protection authorities (“**DPAs**”) and the UK Information Commissioner’s Office (“**ICO**”) and the Gibraltar Regulatory Authority (“**GRA**”) and the Swiss Federal Data Protection and Information Commissioner (“**FDPIC**”) with regard to unresolved complaints concerning our handling of personal information received in reliance on the EU-U.S. DPF and the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF and the Swiss-U.S. DPF.

Arbitration

You have the possibility, under certain conditions, to invoke binding arbitration for complaints regarding DPF compliance not resolved by any of the other mechanisms set out in this DPF Notice or our Privacy Notice. For more information, please see [here](#).

Jurisdiction

The Federal Trade Commission has jurisdiction over Rapid7’s compliance with the EU-U.S. DPF and the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF, and the Swiss-U.S. DPF.

Disclosures to public authorities

Rapid7 may, from time to time, be required to disclose personal information it receives under the EU-U.S. DPF, the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF, and the Swiss-U.S. Data Privacy Framework Swiss-U.S. DPF in response to lawful requests by public authorities, including to meet national security or law enforcement requirements.

Liability for onward transfers

Rapid7 is liable for the processing of personal information it receives under the DPF Principles and subsequently transfers to a third party acting as an agent on its behalf. Rapid7 shall remain liable under the DPF Principles if its agent processes such personal information in a manner inconsistent with the DPF Principles, unless Rapid7 proves that it is not responsible for the event giving rise to the damage.
